# **OVERVIEW**

**The Film Foundation** supports the restoration of films from every genre, era, and region, and shares these treasures with audiences through hundreds of screenings every year at festivals, archives, repertory theatres, and other venues around the world. The foundation educates young people with *The Story of Movies*, its groundbreaking interdisciplinary curriculum that has taught visual literacy to over 10 million US students. In 2019, The Film Foundation welcomed Kathryn Bigelow, Sofia Coppola, Guillermo del Toro, Joanna Hogg, Barry Jenkins, Spike Lee, and Lynne Ramsay to its board of directors. Each has a deep understanding and knowledge of cinema and its history, and is a fierce advocate for its preservation and protection.



#### **Preservation and Restoration**

Working in partnership with archives and studios, The Film Foundation has helped save over 850 films to date. Completed projects in 2019 included: William Wyler's beloved classic, DODSWORTH; Herbert Kline's acclaimed documentary about Czechoslovakia during the Nazi occupation, CRISIS: A FILM OF "THE NAZI WAY"; Arthur Ripley's film noir about a pianist suffering from amnesia, VOICE IN THE WIND; and John Huston's 3-strip Technicolor biography of Toulouse-Lautrec, MOULIN ROUGE.

#### **World Cinema Project**

The Film Foundation's World Cinema Project has restored 40 films from 24 countries to date. Completed projects in 2019 included: THE CLOUD-CAPPED STAR (India, 1960, d. Ritwik Ghatak), EL FANTASMA DEL CONVENTO (Mexico, 1934, d. Fernando de Fuentes), LOS OLVIDADOS (Mexico, 1950, d. Luis Buñuel), LA FEMME AU COUTEAU (Côte d'Ivoire, 1969, d. Timité Bassori), and MUNA MOTO (Cameroon, 1975, d. Jean-Pierre Dikongué-Pipa), the latter two films restored as part of the WCP's African Film Heritage Project.

#### **Exhibition**

Over 700 screenings of TFF-supported restorations were presented in 2019 at museums, archives, festivals, repertory theaters, universities, and other venues around the world. Some highlights from the year: eleven WCP & AFHP restorations were presented at FESPACO's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary, including the restoration premieres of LA FEMME AU COUTEAU and MUNA MOTO; the restoration of PUTNEY SWOPE was selected to screen at theaters across the US as part of "Art House Theater Day;" and the restoration of THE BROKEN BUTTERFLY screened at special events in New York, London, and Los Angeles, marking the 100th anniversary of the film's original release.

#### **Education**

In 2019, The Film Foundation distributed the first three modules of the latest *Story of Movies* curriculum, "Portraits of America: Democracy on Film." Additional modules will be available in 2020. TFF continued its support for the Film Heritage Foundation's Film Preservation & Restoration Workshop India, as well as NYU's Audio Visual Preservation Exchange (APEX) program, which took place in Puerto Rico. TFF partnered again with the Association of Moving Image Archivists (AMIA) on a four-day Level 2 Projection Workshop held at Boston Light & Sound.

# FILM PRESERVATION & RESTORATION







### **DODSWORTH**

1936 | d. William Wyler

Restored by the Academy Film Archive and The Film Foundation, in association with the Samuel Goldwyn Jr. Family Trust, with funding provided by the George Lucas Family Foundation.

Adapted from the 1929 novel by Sinclair Lewis and its 1934 stage adaptation by Sidney Howard, DODSWORTH is the story of a marriage coming undone, between newly-retired midwestern automobile magnate Sam Dodsworth (Walter Huston, in a role that defined him for generations) and his younger, unfulfilled wife Fran (Ruth Chatterton), who desperately craves an exciting and sophisticated lifestyle and begs her husband to make the transatlantic crossing to reinvigorate their marriage on a European tour. Their conflicting desires lead to Fran's affair with an impoverished Austrian count (Gregory Gaye) and Sam's growing affection for an expatriate divorcee (Mary Astor), exposing greater tensions that take them on divergent paths. Brilliantly directed by the great William Wyler, DODSWORTH is an American classic, a soulful, candid and deeply moving portrayal of the disintegration of a marriage.

The 4K digital restoration of DODSWORTH was completed using the 35mm fine grain master positive, the best original existing picture element for the film, which contains re-release title cards but is believed to be otherwise unaltered, and which was likely made directly from the original nitrate negative after the film's reissue. The audio restoration utilized a DA88 track made from a 35mm track negative, which was created using the original nitrate track negative. Scanning and restoration work was completed by Roundabout Entertainment, and audio capture and restoration was done by Deluxe Audio Services.

DODSWORTH had nearly simultaneous East and West Coast restoration premieres at the New York Film Festival and the Academy's Samuel Goldwyn Theater.







### **PUTNEY SWOPE**

1969 | d. Robert Downey Sr.

Restored by the Academy Film Archive and The Film Foundation, with funding provided by the George Lucas Family Foundation.

Robert Downey Sr.'s satire follows Putney Swope, the token black man on the board of a large Madison Avenue ad agency who suddenly finds himself elected company chairman. Swope replaces all the white board members, leaving one token white man and renames the company Truth and Soul, Inc. Swope revolutionizes television advertising with unorthodox shock-effect commercials, which soon catch the attention of the President of the United States who sees them as a threat to his vested interests. Following an assassination attempt, Swope abandons his agency and all of his cash assets go up in smoke.

The 4K restoration of PUTNEY SWOPE was completed using the original picture negative, fine grain master, TV/ censored version magnetic sound master, and original optical track. Scanning and picture restoration were done at Roundabout Entertainment. The audio elements were transferred by Endpoint Audio Labs and restored by Audio Mechanics.

PUTNEY SWOPE had its world restoration premiere at the Locarno Film Festival and the restoration was also selected for inclusion in Art House Theater Day, resulting in over 40 screenings at venues across the US.

### CRISIS: A FILM OF "THE NAZI WAY"

1939 | dirs. Herbert Kline, Hans Burger, and Alexander Hammid

Restored by The Museum of Modern Art and The Film Foundation, with funding provided by the George Lucas Family Foundation.

The first documentary to report on the approaching catastrophe in Europe, Herbert Kline, acclaimed documentary filmmaker and a leader of the left-leaning New York Film and Photo League, posed as a Nazi sympathizer to bluff his way into Czechoslovakia just after the Czech government capitulated to the German Reich. As the crisis was unfolding, he filmed rallies, troop movements, and ordinary Czech citizens preparing for war. Working with Czech-American photographer and writer Alexander Hammid, he assembled this remarkably vivid documentary film.

CRISIS: A FILM OF "THE NAZI WAY" premiered in 1939 with a running time of 95 minutes. It was re-edited to create a 72-minute and a 40-minute version. While the premiere version is believed lost, The Museum of Modern Art holds the best available materials on both shorter versions. The 4K digital restoration was accomplished by using the incomplete original picture and track negatives along with a nitrate print and nitrate masters of the shortened reissue. Wet-gate scanning and image cleanup were performed by Image Protection Services and Deluxe Entertainment Services restored the sound.

CRISIS: A FILM OF "THE NAZI WAY" had its world restoration premiere at II Cinema Ritrovato in Bologna, Italy.









# **ALIBI** 1929 | d. Roland West

Restored by UCLA Film & Television Archive and The Film Foundation, in collaboration with Cohen Film Collection. Restoration funding provided by the George Lucas Family Foundation.

Based on the 1927 play, *Nightstick*, ALIBI is about gangster Chick Williams, who after being released from prison, rejoins Buck Bachman's mob. He swiftly woos and marries Joan, the daughter of a policeman. During a hold-up, Chick murders a cop and uses Joan as his alibi. An undercover agent, Danny McGann and policeman Tommy Glennon, who is also in love with Joan, are convinced that Chick is the guilty party. They pursue him in hopes of convicting him of the crime. Little do they realize that trying to capture Chick will only lead to more misdirection and murder.

The 4K digital restoration of ALIBI was completed using the best remaining elements, a 35mm safety print held at the BFI and the original sound discs from 1929 held at UCLA Film & Television Archive. The 35mm print was made from the damaged and decomposing negative circa 1957 and is missing eight minutes compared to the original release, which was 90 minutes. UCLA's sound discs provided a road map for the original version. It is suspected that the losses are due to the removal of a three-minute musical number circa 1934 for a contemplated reissue, and decomposition is responsible for the remaining lost five minutes. Wet-gate scanning was done at Image Protection Services, with additional restoration work completed by Roundabout Entertainment, and the audio restoration was completed at Audio Mechanics. The original main title sequence was lost with only 16 frames of the cast list remaining. This sequence was recreated at Roundabout Entertainment using scans from the negative of West's next UA production after ALIBI, THE BAT WHISPERS, as a template. Additionally at Roundabout Entertainment, shots of the nightclub and Joan's apartment were looped and manipulated to cover missing fragments. Stills of the prison release sequence and the missing song were located in the United Artists Collection at the University of Madison, and these were used to provide a pictorial representation of the scenes.

ALIBI had its world restoration premiere at the UCLA Festival of Preservation.

# THE CROOKED WAY

1949 | d. Robert Florey

Restored by UCLA Film & Television Archive and The Film Foundation, with funding provided by the George Lucas Family Foundation.

Eddie Rice, a World War II veteran suffering from amnesia, is released from a veteran's hospital and decides to return to his home in Los Angeles. Trying to retrace his steps and learn his true identity, he soon discovers that before the war he was a double-crossing gangster named Eddie Riccardi who had many enemies. In addition to avoiding those he wronged and wish him dead, he must also dodge policeman Joe Williams, who is trailing him. Eddie bumps into his ex-wife, Nina, while trying to clear his name and stay ahead of his former partner in crime, Vince Alexander. What he fails to realize is that Nina is working with Vince. As Vince does everything he can to cause Eddie's demise, Nina changes sides and joins forces with Eddie. As the plot thickens and the stakes rise, Eddie and Nina must work together to take down Vince and decide if they want to give their relationship another shot.

Four 35mm prints held by UCLA represent the best available elements on THE CROOKED WAY. A full wet-gate dupe negative was made using these prints in order to fill in missing footage and damage present in each of the individual prints. The audio was restored using the 35mm nitrate track negative as the primary element and a new optical track negative was made. The new track was then synced with the picture dupe negative. An answer print, release prints, and a fine grain were created. The dupe negative was scanned and slight digital corrections were made, in addition to color grading, in order to create a DCP of the restoration.

THE CROOKED WAY had its world restoration premiere at the UCLA Festival of Preservation and is included in the touring version of the festival available through 2020.





### **VOICE IN THE WIND**

1944 | d. Arthur Ripley

Restored by UCLA Film & Television Archive and The Film Foundation, in collaboration with Cohen Film Collection. Restoration funding provided by the George Lucas Family Foundation.

During the Nazi occupation of Czechoslovakia, acclaimed Czech pianist Jan Volny is allowed to present a concert but forbidden from playing the patriotic song "The Moldau." Swept up in the music, Volny plays the song, which results in his capture and torture by the Nazis and seperation from his wife, Marya. Volny escapes, but the torture has caused amnesia. He flees to the island of Guadeloupe on a fishing boat to recover and try to regain his memory. While on the island, he becomes a refugee smuggler and is given the nickname "El Hombre." Volny is unaware that also on the island is Marya with the Hoffmans, the kind family who rescued her. One night while playing the piano, Marya hears Volny's music, which she immediately recognizes and goes to investigate. However, the couple's fate is doomed and their reunion ends in tragedy.

UCLA Film & Television Archive holds a 35mm print of VOICE IN THE WIND, which represents the best remaining element. A wet-gate dupe negative and first trial print were made from UCLA's 35mm print. Losses and damage in the element were filled in using a nitrate dupe negative held in the Rohauer Collection at the Library of Congress. Both dupe negatives were scanned at 4K resolution to complete the digital restoration of this title. A 16mm negative held by Cohen Media was utilized to insert shots missing from both 35mm elements and was also the only element that contained the original "United Artists" distributors card in the main and end titles.

VOICE IN THE WIND had its world restoration premiere at the UCLA Festival of Preservation and is included in the touring version of the festival available through 2020.











### THE BROKEN BUTTERFLY

1919 | d. Maurice Tourneur

Restored by The Film Foundation at L'Immagine Ritrovata laboratory in association with Fondation Jérôme Seydoux–Pathé. Restoration funding provided by Louis XIII Cognac.

Based on the novel *Marcene* by Penelope Knapp, THE BROKEN BUTTERFLY is a heart-wrenching story about a naïve young woman named Marcene Elliot, who lives in Canada with her cruel Aunt Zabie. While wandering in the woods one day, she meets composer Darrell Thorne and they fall in love. Darrell writes a symphony named for Marcene and asks her to accompany him to New York for its premiere, but she refuses, fearing her aunt's anger. After their affair, Marcene gives birth to a daughter and her aunt forces her out of the house. When Darrell returns, he is told by a bitter Aunt Zabie that Marcene is dead. A devastated Darrell travels to relieve his suffering and meets Marcene's sister on the Riviera, where she is performing his symphony. They fall in love, marry, and return to Canada to discover that Marcene is still alive but dying of a broken heart. Darrell's love revived, he proposes to Marcene after his wife releases him. Marcene dies content, allowing Darrell and her sister to resume their marriage and raise Marcene's child.

THE BROKEN BUTTERFLY was restored using the best remaining element, a 35mm nitrate picture duplicate negative preserved by Fondation Jérôme Seydoux-Pathé. This surviving negative of the French version was carefully scanned at 4K resolution at L'Image Retrouvée in Paris. The element included French flashtitles (intertitles that are only a few frames long), as well as short leaders in the middle of the reels pertaining to the color tinting and editing. A color filter was applied to every section following the indications reported on the leaders. Orange was used for the internal and daytime shots and blue was used for night scenes. Each scene was also given a number so it could be reordered after the tinting process was completed. The last step necessary to reconfigure the proper edit was to extend the length of the flashtitles to be readable at the proper frame rate, which was determined to be 18 frames per second. Composer Donald Sosin was commissioned to create and perform a score for the film.

The restoration of THE BROKEN BUTTERFLY premiered, 100 years after its original release, in France at the Lumière Film Festival, in New York at the Whitby Theater, in London at BFI Southbank, and in Los Angeles at the Egyptian Theatre.

# **SPECIAL PROJECTS**





### **MOULIN ROUGE**

1952 | d. John Huston

Restored by The Film Foundation in collaboration with Park Circus, Romulus Films and MGM with additional funding provided by the Franco-American Cultural Fund, a unique partnership between the Directors Guild of America (DGA), the Motion Picture Association of America (MPAA), the Société des Auteurs, Compositeurs et Editeurs de Musique (SACEM), and the Writers Guild of America, West (WGAW).

Based on the novel by Pierre La Mure, MOULIN ROUGE is a fictional account of the life of famed artist Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec, played brilliantly by José Ferrer. The son of a wealthy, aristocratic family, Henri moves to Montmartre, the center of Parisian bohemian life. However, due to a childhood injury, Henri's legs are badly deformed and his personal life is often unhappy as a result. One day, he meets a young woman, Marie, and soon falls in love with her, but finds it increasingly difficult to balance his personal life, his artistic pursuits, and his family pressures. Director John Huston was fascinated by the artist's life and worked closely on the script with Ferrer, and co-writer Anthony Veiller, to create an outstanding period piece, with stunning costumes and cinematography that recreated the look of Toulouse-Lautrec's paintings. The film received seven Oscar nominations, winning for art direction and costume design.

MOULIN ROUGE was restored using the 35mm original nitrate 3-strip Technicolor negative. 4K scanning, color grading, and digital image restoration were completed by Cineric, Inc., in New York, and the audio restoration was done by Chace Audio in Burbank. Special thanks to Grover Crisp for his consultation on this restoration.

The world restoration premiere of MOULIN ROUGE took place at Cannes as part of Cannes Classics.

### NATIONAL FILM PRESERVATION FOUNDATION

#### NFPF FEDERAL GRANT PROGRAM

The NFPF grant provides support to libraries, archives, and museums across the United States through funds authorized and appropriated by the U.S. Congress under the National Film Preservation Act of 1996. The grant allows for preservation masters and public access copies of orphan films with cultural and historical significance to be created. Under the terms of the legislation, the NFPF is required to raise matching funds from non-governmental entities to sustain its operations. Therefore, The Film Foundation's support is critical in underwriting these expenses. In 2019, 35 grants were awarded for the preservation of 74 films, and to date, the NFPF has helped preserve more than 2,478 films at institutions in all 50 states, Puerto Rico, and the District of Columbia.

#### **AVANT-GARDE MASTERS GRANT**

Created in 2002, the Avant-Garde Masters Grant's sole purpose is to preserve American experimental film. Often produced with limited funds and commercial prospects, experimental work is the category of filmmaking most threatened by deterioration and loss, making support from the NFPF and TFF essential.

Fully funded by TFF, the grants provide \$50,000 annually for the preservation of avant-garde films. Over the past seventeen years, the initiative has saved 177 avant-garde works by 69 experimental filmmakers, making these important films available to audiences, in many cases, for the first time in decades. ### THE CLOUD-CAPPED STAR

1960 | India, d. Ritwik Ghatak

Restored by the Criterion Collection in cooperation with The Film Foundation's World Cinema Project and the Cineteca di Bologna.

Written and directed by visionary Bengali filmmaker Ritwik Ghatak, THE CLOUD-CAPPED STAR, based on the novel by Shaktipada Rajguru, takes place in Calcutta after a refugee family is uprooted by the Partition of India. The film focuses on their eldest daughter, Neeta, who single-handedly keeps the family afloat. The other family members, including a vain sister, childish brother, cruel mother, and hapless father, do nothing to assist her. At the expense of her own hopes and dreams, Neeta puts her family first and grows increasingly self-effacing as she takes on more responsibilities. Her chances of happiness diminish by the day and she even rejects the love of her life so as not to incur any wedding expenses. She is left crushed and ailing, especially when her sister, in a cruel twist of fate, marries the man she loves. Ghatak uses off-balance compositions, discontinuous editing, and a densely layered soundtrack to create this unique and devastating melodrama that explores the tragedies of Indian history and the inequities of traditional gender roles.

A new digital transfer of THE CLOUD-CAPPED STAR was created from the 35mm original camera negative, which was preserved at the National Film Archive of India in Pune. This element also includes several shots inserted from a duplicate negative. A 35mm print from the Library of Congress was used for sections of the film where the original camera negative was damaged or incomplete. The original monaural soundtrack was remastered from the LOC's 35mm print and a digital source from the British Film Institute.

# **EL FANTASMA DEL CONVENTO**

1934 | Mexico, d. Fernando de Fuentes

Restored by UCLA Film & Television Archive and The Film Foundation's World Cinema Project, with funding provided by the George Lucas Family Foundation.

EL FANTASMA DEL CONVENTO is a pioneering work of Mexican gothic horror by director Fernando de Fuentes, one of the most versatile filmmakers of Mexican cinema's early sound period. Three friends, Cristina, Eduardo, and Alfonso, get lost in the woods and are rescued by a monk, who brings them to his monastery. The Father Superior tells them the story of a monk who seduced his friend's wife, and when he died, he could not find peace. His soul was forced to return to his cursed cell at the monastery. Mirroring the characters in the Father Superior's story, Cristina soon tries to seduce Alfonso, who finds himself in the same cell as the eternally restless monk.

The 4K digital restoration of EL FANTASMA DEL CONVENTO utilized the original 35mm nitrate picture and track negatives and a 16mm acetate composite duplicate negative. Materials were scanned and digital restoration work was completed at Roundabout Entertainment in Burbank, CA. The audio restoration was completed by Audio Mechanics, also in Burbank.

The restoration of EL FANTASMA DEL CONVENTO had its world premiere at "To Save & Project: MoMA's International Festival of Film Preservation."











# LOS OLVIDADOS

1950 | Mexico, d. Luis Buñuel

Restored by The Film Foundation's World Cinema Project at L'Immagine Ritrovata in collaboration with Fundación Televisa, Cineteca Nacional México, and Filmoteca de la UNAM. Restoration funding provided by the Material World Foundation.

Inspired in part by Vittorio De Sica's SHOESHINE, Luis Buñuel's LOS OLVIDADOS is considered one of the greatest Mexican films of all time. Set in the slums of Mexico City, the film is an intense and disturbing portrait of a gang of juvenile criminals. The leader of the group, Jaibo, who recently escaped from reformatory prison, vows revenge against Julian, whom he believes is responsible for his imprisonment. After witnessing Julian's murder, Pedro wants nothing more than to return home and live a comfortable and safe life off the streets. Sadly, his mother shows little affection and ultimately rejects him. Wrongly accused of stealing money, Pedro is sent to reform school, where a sympathetic school director takes him under his wing. However, Pedro ultimately fails to evade the grasp of Jaibo and the corrupting environment of the slums. Though Buñuel is unflinching and unsentimental in his portrayal, the film ultimately presents a compassionate, though devastating, look at the lives of street children.

The digital restoration of LOS OLVIDADOS was carried out by L'Immagine Ritrovata using the original camera and soundtrack nitrate negatives preserved at Filmoteca de la UNAM. The soundtrack was digitized by Cineteca Nacional de México. Gabriel Figueroa Flores supervised the grading.

The restoration of LOS OLVIDADOS had its world premiere at Cannes Classics with an introduction by Olivia Harrison of the Material World Foundation.

# LA FEMME AU COUTEAU

1969 | Côte d'Ivoire, d. Timité Bassori

Restored by The Film Foundation's World Cinema Project and Cineteca di Bologna at L'Image Retrouvée and L'Immagine Ritrovata laboratories. Restoration funded by the George Lucas Family Foundation.

This restoration is part of the African Film Heritage Project, created by The Film Foundation, FEPACI and UNESCO—in collaboration with Cineteca di Bologna—to help locate, restore, and disseminate African cinema.

LA FEMME AU COUTEAU is considered by many to be Timité Bassori's most accomplished work. The film weaves together two story lines, with the main one focusing on a young African intellectual who frequently has nightmares of a woman with a knife. These nightmares cause him sexual inhibition and prevent him from having normal relationships. Through a combination of traditional African healing and Western psychoanalysis, he ultimately realizes that these "sightings" are the result of a traumatic experience at a younger age when his strict mother caught him embracing a girl and chastised him for it. The subplot focuses on an older African gentleman who wanders through the streets wearing a tuxedo. He, too, has visions of a woman. He conjures the visions by wearing a leather bracelet and believes that he has become romantically involved with the woman only he can see. Bassori plays with these two stories, creating different layers of temporality and reality, pitting the real, the psychic, and the mystical against each other.

The 4K restoration of LA FEMME AU COUTEAU was made from the 35mm original camera and sound negatives. The original camera negative was damaged by mold, dirt, and scratches, and therefore required an extensive amount of digital restoration. Director Timité Bassori supervised the picture grading.

LA FEMME AU COUTEAU had its world restoration premiere at FESPACO, the Panafrican Film and Television Festival of Ouagadougou in Burkina Faso.







# **MUNA MOTO**

1975 | Cameroon, d. Jean-Pierre Dikongué-Pipa

This restoration is part of the African Film Heritage Project, created by The Film Foundation, FEPACI and UNESCO—in collaboration with Cineteca di Bologna—to help locate, restore, and disseminate African cinema.

MUNA MOTO is an inspired work by director Jean-Pierre Dikongué-Pipa that has many political undertones, including a critique of the dowry system, as well as an exploration of power and political legitimacy. The film is about Ngando, a young man who falls in love with Ndomé. However, the couple is unable to marry because Ngando cannot afford the dowry. Mbongo, Ngando's rich, cruel, and heirless uncle, takes advantage of the situation and sees young and beautiful Ndomé as his last chance to have a child. Mbongo marries Ndomé instead of giving his nephew the money for the dowry as promised. What Mbongo doesn't realize is that Ndomé is already carrying Ngando's baby. Unable to accept the abusive and unjust situation, Ngando decides to steal the child. Dikongué-Pipa uses flashbacks within flashbacks, making it nearly impossible to discern the past from the present, dream from reality, and fact from fiction.

The 4K restoration of MUNA MOTO was made from the 35mm original camera and sound negatives and a second generation dupe negative. Despite wet-gate scanning to minimize mold damage, some sections of the camera negative had to be replaced by scanning the dupe negative. Following director Jean-Pierre Dikongué-Pipa's suggestion, the dupe negative was also used for the opening and closing cards which differed from the original negative. A vintage 35mm print was used as a reference for picture grading.

MUNA MOTO had its world restoration premiere at FESPACO, the Panafrican Film and Television Festival of Ouagadougou in Burkina Faso.




# **EDUCATION**

# The Story of Movies

The Film Foundation's educational initiative, *The Story of Movies* (SOM), launched its most recent curriculum program in 2019. "Portraits of America: Democracy on Film" utilizes SOM's groundbreaking interdisciplinary approach to cinema literacy, and its emphasis on the historical and cultural significance of film, to highlight movies that express the ideals and challenges inherent in our democratic society. The films in this program were selected because they humanize the abstract concepts of democracy through the compelling stories they tell about people—fictional and real, famous and not.

The first three modules from "Portraits of America" became available in May: The Immigrant Experience, The American Laborer, and Civil Rights. Each thematic module focuses on five or more classic films from the earliest days of cinema throughout the 20th century.

All of the materials are available online at storyofmovies.org and are free of charge to qualified teachers.



The module on immigration features THE IMMIGRANT (1917, d. Charlie Chaplin), AMERICA AMERICA (1963, d. Elia Kazan), THE GODFATHER, PART II (1974, d. Francis Ford Coppola), EL NORTE (1983, d. Gregory Nava) and THE NAMESAKE (2006, d. Mira Nair).

The titles in the labor module include the 1912 social drama, CHILDREN WHO LABOR, as well as MATEWAN (1987, d. John Sayles), HARLAN COUNTY U.S.A. (1976, d. Barbara Kopple), AT THE RIVER I STAND (1993, dirs. David Appleby, Allison Graham and Steven Ross), SALT OF THE EARTH (1954, d. Herbert Biberman) and NORMA RAE (1979, d. Martin Ritt).

The civil rights module begins with rare footage of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and then covers KING: A FILMED RECORD... MONTGOMERY TO MEMPHIS (1970, d. Ely Landau), INTRUDER IN THE DUST (1949, d. Clarence Brown), THE TIMES OF HARVEY MILK (1984, d. Robert Epstein) and SMOKE SIGNALS (1998, d. Chris Eyre).




In November, TFF was selected to present a workshop about "Portraits of America" at the 2019 annual conference of the National Council for the Social Studies (NCSS). Focusing on films about labor, the presentation was attended by educators from across the U.S. and beyond. After the workshop, TFF had a booth which attracted teachers, administrators and curriculum specialists. Visitors to the booth were given classroom posters to share with their colleagues.

The foundation was also invited to partner with the American Federation of Teachers by participating in its "Share My Lesson" website. This excellent resource has over one million users nationwide. It offers free downloadable curriculum materials, which are contributed both by individual teachers and prestigious organizations such as the Center for Civic Education, National Public Radio, and the National Science Foundation. TFF posted its first lesson, on Charlie Chaplin's THE IMMIGRANT, in November and will be offering several others culled from the "Portraits of America" program throughout 2020. These lessons offer a glimpse of the wide array of materials available on the SOM website, and the AFT site affords many opportunities to link back to that site as well as to the main Film Foundation website.
