


OVERVIEW









The Film Foundation (TFF) is dedicated to preserving the world's cinematic heritage by collaborating with its archive and studio partners to preserve and restore endangered films. Every era, genre, and region of the world is represented in the over 1000 films restored by TFF to date, which are screened for global audiences at festivals, archives, museums, universities, and repertory theaters, as well as on streaming platforms. The foundation also created *The Story of Movies*, a free educational program to teach students to understand film language and appreciate the historic and cultural significance of cinema as an art form. TFF's success in these endeavors is made possible through the ongoing commitment and generous support of its Board of Directors, along with corporate, foundation, and individual contributions.

PRESERVATION AND RESTORATION

In 2024, The Film Foundation completed the restoration of 34 films in collaboration with its archive and studio partners. Projects this year included: an Italian comedy from 1961, FANTASMI A ROMA, directed by Antonio Pietrangeli, featuring Marcello Mastroianni playing multiple characters; Alfred Hitchcock's LIFEBOAT (1944), a gripping story about nine people adrift at sea during wartime; a quintessential pre-Code romp, THE GREEKS HAD A WORD FOR THEM (1932, d. Lowell Sherman); Otto Preminger's SAINT JOAN (1957) starring Jean Seberg as Joan of Arc; and Michael Powell and Emeric Pressburger's WWII thriller, THE SMALL BACK ROOM (1949).

WORLD CINEMA PROJECT

To date, The Film Foundation's World Cinema Project has restored 64 films from 31 countries. This past year included the restoration of: THE FALL OF OTRAR (Kazakhstan, 1991, d. Ardak Amirkulov); SHADOWS OF FORGOTTEN ANCESTORS (Ukraine, 1965, Sergei Parajanov); GHATASHRADDHA (India, 1977, d. Girish Kasaravalli); STARS IN BROAD DAYLIGHT (Syria, 1988, d. Ossama Mohammed); and MARÍA CANDELARIA (Mexico, 1943, d. Emilio Fernández). As part of the African Film Heritage Project, CAMP DE THIAROYE (Senegal/Algeria/Tunisia, 1988), co-directed by Ousmane Sembène and Thierno Faty Sow, was restored and premiered as part of Cannes Classics.

EXHIBITION

There were over 900 screenings worldwide of TFF-supported restorations in 2024. Highlights included world restoration premieres of John Ford's THE SEARCHERS (1956) and Alfred Hitchcock's NORTH BY NORTHWEST (1959) in 70mm; the world restoration premiere and subsequent week-long run of THE SPOOK WHO SAT BY THE DOOR (1973, d. Ivan Dixon) at BAM in Brooklyn; a tribute to the World Cinema Project at the Irish Film Institute; and world restoration premieres at Il Cinema Ritrovato in Bologna, the Venice International Film Festival, New York Film Festival, and BFI London Film Festival.

EDUCATION

The Film Foundation's *Story of Movies* program completed "Portraits of America: Democracy on Film" in 2024. Encompassing over 40 films, the curriculum is a comprehensive look at how filmmakers have addressed the fundamental issues, conflicts, and aspirations of American society. In March, curriculum author Catherine Gourley presented a workshop at a virtual conference hosted by the American Federation of Teachers (AFT). The webinar, "Critical Thinking and Viewing: Integrating National Film Study Standards in the Classroom," was viewed by over 1000 educators and received a 5-star rating from participants.

ACADEMY FILM ARCHIVE

SAINT JOAN

1957, d. Otto Preminger

Based on George Bernard Shaw's play and adapted for the screen by acclaimed author Graham Greene, Otto Preminger's cinematic take on the Joan of Arc story is notable for its leading lady—a then-unknown Jean Seberg—who was discovered by Preminger when he saw over 18,000 potential Joans as part of a massive talent search. Richard Widmark, as Charles VII, serves as Joan's foil, his rise in power accompanying the well-orchestrated fall of Joan that ends with her death sentence to be burned at the stake. Joined by John Gielgud and Anton Walbrook, as the Earl of Warwick and the Bishop of Beauvais respectively, the stellar cast explores Joan's life through flashbacks instigated by her ghost tormenting Charles VII twenty-five years after her death.

The 4K restoration of SAINT JOAN was completed using the original 35mm picture negative and 35mm optical track negative. Scanning and digital restoration was done by Roundabout Entertainment. A new 35mm track positive was produced at YCM Laboratory and was subsequently captured by Endpoint Audio Labs. The final audio restoration was done at Audio Mechanics.

SAINT JOAN had its world restoration premiere as part of "Present Past: A Celebration of Film Preservation" at the Academy Museum of Motion Pictures.

FANTASMI A ROMA

1961, d. Antonio Pietrangeli

Antonio Pietrangeli's FANTASMI A ROMA tells the story of the Principe di Roviano and what happens when he dies and his nephew inherits his palazzo, which is inhabited by the spirits of the former residents. The spirits don't want their home to be turned into a supermarket—the nephew's intended plan—so they enlist the help of a 16th century painter in hopes of certifying the property as historically significant. Nino Rota and Giuseppe Rotunno, legendary composer and cinematographer, respectively, create the memorable score and unique painterly images. A star-studded Technicolor comedy rooted in the fantastical, FANTASMI A ROMA's cast includes Sandra Milo,



Eduardo De Filippo, Tino Buazzelli, Vittorio Gassman, and the great Marcello Mastroianni portraying three different characters. Restored in 4K using the original camera and sound negatives at L'Immagine Ritrovata. Grading was supervised by Luca Bigazzi. The world restoration premiere of FANTASMI A ROMA took place at the Rome Film Festival.

THE GREEKS HAD A WORD FOR THEM

1932, d. Lowell Sherman

Ina Claire shines alongside a sparkling cast that includes Joan Blondell, Madge Evans, and a charmingly sleazy Lowell Sherman, who also directs, in a Depression-era pre-Code comedy about romance amongst the Manhattan upper-class. The film is an adaptation of Zoe Akins 1930 play which was titled *The Greeks Had a Word for It*, with "it" being traded for "them" to appease producer Samuel Goldwyn, who thought it was too risqué. The actresses star as a gang of showgirls hilariously oscillating between loving and hating each other as they make use of their looks and wit in hopes of attaining the status, money, and love they desire.

The primary source of the 4K restoration was a 35mm nitrate print held at the Library of Congress. The print was missing

some frames and has replacement opening and end title cards that were added when the film was re-released under the title THREE BROADWAY GIRLS. For this restoration, scans from a 16mm print held at the George Eastman Museum were used to reintroduce the original title cards and missing frames. 4K scanning was done at the Library of Congress National Audio-Visual Conservation Center and the digital restoration was completed at L'Immagine Ritrovata. Audio restoration was completed by Audio Mechanics.

THE MAGNIFICENT MATADOR

1955, d. Budd Boetticher

Anthony Quinn plays Luís Santos in Budd Boetticher's rarely seen Cinemascope film THE MAGNIFICENT MATADOR. Instead of creating an action movie, Boetticher, who also has a story credit on the film, focuses on the psychology of being a bullfighter, crafting an entertaining melodrama that explores what the sport means to the country of Mexico, where the entire film was shot. Santos, a beloved matador, is conflicted about presenting a new bullfighter, one he deems too young. His hesitancy leads him into the life of American Karen Harrison—Maureen O'Hara in a characteristically spirited performance—who fell in love with Santos the first time she saw him in the ring. As their relationship grows, Santos eventually confesses that the young bullfighter is actually his illegitimate son and that he fears his participation in the violent sport.

The 4K restoration of THE MAGNIFICENT MATADOR was completed using the earliest surviving elements: acetate color separation positives of the red, green, and blue records. These elements were scanned, composited, registered, and restored at Roundabout Entertainment. Given that the stereo magnetic tracks no longer survive, the audio from a magnetic scope stereo print from the George Eastman Museum was transferred and used as the primary source for the audio restoration done at Audio Mechanics.

BLACK GIRL

1972, d. Ossie Davis

In 1972, actor and activist Ossie Davis directed J. E. Franklin's screen adaptation of her play *Black Girl* for his third feature film. The play had opened off Broadway in 1971 and, like Davis's film, focuses on a young black woman—Billie Jean (Peggy Pettitt)—and her effort to create a new life for herself by becoming a dancer. Billie Jean lives with her janitor mom, Mama Rosie (Louise Stubbs), along with her older half-sisters, their children, her grandmother, and her grandmother's boyfriend. Together, the different generations navigate the difficulties of their situation with Davis shining a bold light on the rooted realities of poverty and its impact on relationships. The talented ensemble creates a vibrant, complicated, unabashedly honest world with Pettitt and Stubbs at the emotional center, fiercely embodying their characters in unforgettable performances.

The 4K restoration of BLACK GIRL was completed using the original picture and soundtrack negatives. Scanning and digital restoration was done at Illuminate. The audio track was captured by Simon Daniel Sound and restored by Audio Mechanics.

UCLA Film & Television Archive and The Film Foundation, in collaboration with the Seth MacFarlane Foundation, curated and restored this program of 12 shorts from the extensive animation collection held in UCLA's Paramount Studios Collection. The selection concentrates primarily on the immense talents and prolific output of Max and Dave Fleischer, as well as stop-motion legend George Pal and early animation pioneer Paul Terry. While each employed different techniques and styles, they all exemplified the innovative spirit of animation in the 1920s–1940s, a period in which the art form was continually expanded and reimagined.

Digital restoration was completed at Roundabout Entertainment, Audio Mechanics, and Simon Daniel Sound using unique original pre-print elements and/or print sources which were mostly nitrate. Special thanks to Paramount Pictures Archive, Jane Fleischer Reid, Mauricio Alvarado, Arnold Leibovit, and Jerry Beck.

The world restoration premiere of 9 of these animated shorts took place at the TCM Classic Film Festival.

THE SMALL BACK ROOM

1949, dirs. Michael Powell and Emeric Pressburger

After making their Technicolor masterpiece THE RED SHOES (1948), Michael Powell and Emeric Pressburger made this taut black and white suspense film based on the acclaimed novel by Nigel Balchin. Underneath the more thrilling aspects of this World War II picture is a tender but complex romance between David Farrar's bomb expert, Sammy, and Susan, a secretary, played by Kathleen Byron. Both actors had wowed critics and audiences when they appeared together in BLACK NARCISSUS (1947). As always, Powell and Pressburger take great care in the creation of their characters, giving Sammy a prosthetic leg and revealing his drinking problem through a dizzying sequence rooted in German Expressionism. The character drama comes to a head when Farrar is hired to disarm a

complicated new German weapon on a beach in Dorset. In a 1968 interview with Bertrand Tavernier, Powell told him that THE SMALL BACK ROOM "is my best film."

GEORGE STEVENS: A FILMMAKER'S JOURNEY

1984, d. George Stevens Jr.

GEORGE STEVENS: A FILMMAKER'S JOURNEY is a heartfelt tribute from a son to his father. The intimate documentary portrait makes use of an extraordinary amount of footage, including home movies and a historically significant wartime journal that features footage shot by Stevens, including the only color footage of the landing at Normandy in World War II. Interviews with Hollywood royalty like Fred Astaire, Ginger Rogers, Frank Capra, John Huston, and Katharine Hepburn shed light on Stevens' creative process, bringing his storied film career to life. Together, these elements allow George

Stevens Jr. to create a vital document of a man but also of a time and place, America itself.



NATIONAL FILM PRESERVATION FOUNDATION

NFPF FEDERAL GRANT PROGRAM

The National Film Preservation Foundation (NFPF) provides Congressionally authorized and appropriated funding for preservation projects at American archives, museums, and libraries. Established by the National Film Preservation Act of 1996, the NFPF seeks to preserve motion pictures which might otherwise be forgotten, primarily orphan films that are culturally and historically significant. In addition to preserving the films, grant recipients must create preservation masters and public access copies, ensuring the future exhibition of these treasures. The legislation which created the NFPF mandates that the organization raise matching funds from non-governmental sources to cover its operating costs, which is why The Film Foundation's support is so critical.

In 2024, the NFPF awarded 33 grants, funding the preservation of 64 films. Since the program's inception, it has awarded grants to institutions in every U.S. state as well as Puerto Rico and the District of Columbia, helping to preserve more than 2.856 films.

AVANT-GARDE MASTERS GRANTS

Work by avant-garde filmmakers is typically produced on a very tight budget and with limited commercial viability; as a result, it often faces the highest possible risk of deterioration and loss. The NFPF and The Film Foundation created the Avant-Garde Masters Grant program in 2002 with the singular goal of preserving American experimental cinema. Funded entirely by TFF, \$50,000 in grant funding is made available every year. Since the program was initiated, these grants have saved important works by 91 filmmakers, with a total of 234 films preserved and made available to audiences, often for the first time in decades.

THE FALL OF OTRAR

Kazakhstan, 1991, d. Ardak Amirkulov

Shot in 1990, as Kazakhstan was asserting its independence, THE FALL OF OTRAR charts political intrigue among the Kipchaks, a confederation of tribes living in the Central Asian Steppes, before the invasion of Genghis Khan. Ardak Amirkulov's ferocious images, in a mix of both color and black and white, capture the epic landscapes, the ornate splendor of the architecture, and the extreme violence of the times in stunning detail, creating a film of great artistry and historical importance.

Restored in 4K from the original camera and sound negatives. Scanning was performed by ARDFILM in Almaty,

Kazakhstan. Ardak Amirkulov supervised the scanning and approved the final grading. Special thanks to Daniel Bird. Restoration work was completed by L'Immagine Ritrovata.

GHATASHRADDHA

India, 1977, d. Girish Kasaravalli

Rooted in the historic ritual of Ghatashraddha, which calls for the ostracism of women who transgress the rigid sexual code of orthodox Brahmin society, Girish Kasaravalli's film tells the story of Yamuna, a young widow who finds herself in a perilous situation when she gets pregnant by her teacher. When her circumstances are brought to light, she is exiled from the village by her father.

GHATASHRADDHA was restored at L'Immagine Ritrovata laboratory using the 35mm original camera negative preserved

at the NFDC-National Film Archive of India and a 35mm print preserved at the Library of Congress.

GHATASHRADDHA had its world restoration premiere at the Venice International Film Festival.

MARÍA CANDELARIA

Mexico, 1943, d. Emilio Fernández

Made during the Golden Age of Mexican cinema, MARÍA CANDELARIA was awarded the Palme d'Or at the 1946 Cannes Film Festival, bringing acclaim to the film, its director Emilio Fernández, and cinematographer Gabriel Figeroa. Dolores del Río plays María, a flower seller in the floating gardens of Xochimilco. Pedro Armendáriz portrays Lorenzo Rafael with whom María falls in love. Soon the two want to get married but their love is challenged by many obstacles. In addition to being shunned by her community for being the daughter of a prostitute, María must contend with Don Damian (Miguel Inclán), a greedy shop owner who is also in love with her. When María falls gravely ill with malaria, Lorenzo steals a bottle of medicine from Don Damian's shop, with tragic results.

The elements used for the restoration of MARÍA CANDELARIA included the original nitrate picture negative, a 35mm nitrate dupe negative, and a 35mm safety fine-grain. The nitrate elements were scanned by Filmoteca UNAM and the safety element was scanned at Roundabout Entertainment, where the digital restoration work was also completed. Audio elements were captured at Endpoint Audio and restored by Audio Mechanics.

MARÍA CANDELARIA had its world restoration premiere at the Academy Museum of Motion Pictures.

SHADOWS OF FORGOTTEN ANCESTORS

Ukraine, 1965, d. Sergei Parajanov

A turning point in the career of visionary filmmaker Sergei Parajanov, SHADOWS OF FORGOTTEN ANCESTORS was filmed in Ukraine's Oleksandr Dovzhenko National Film Studio. The studio asked him to adapt Mykhailo Kotsiubynsky's 1911 novel and Parajanov responded by making a film deeply rooted in Ukrainian culture and the language and rhythms of poetry. Often elliptical and given to fantastical interruptions, the film centers on two lovers from different families involved in a blood feud and was made alongside the Hutsul people in the Carpathian Mountains in West Ukraine.

Scanned in 4K by Fixafilm laboratory in Warsaw using a low contrast 35mm print donated by Eric Liknaitzky to Daniel Bird and now deposited at the Austrian Film Museum. Restoration work was completed by L'Immagine Ritrovata. A vintage print from the Harvard Film Archive was used as a reference for the grading. Special thanks to Olena Honcharuk and Daniel Bird.

STARS IN BROAD DAYLIGHT

Syria, 1988, d. Ossama Mohammed

A seething indictment of the Baathist dictatorship, STARS IN BROAD DAYLIGHT was banned in Syria after one screening but selected for the Directors' Fortnight section at the Cannes Film Festival. A sharp political critique, and a comical family drama, the film centers on weddings gone awry and the consequences therein. Through the family dysfunction, director Ossama Mohammed deftly explores the realities and psychological impact of life under dictatorship.

CAMP DE THIAROYE

Senegal/Algeria/Tunisia, 1988, dirs. Ousmane Sembène and Thierno Faty Sow)

Based on historical events, CAMP DE THIAROYE focuses on a group of West African soldiers who return to Senegal after fighting as part of the French army in Europe during World War II. The soldiers band together to demand their rightful payment for their service but are instead brutally massacred in the middle of the night at the hands of the French army. It's an ending filled with horror and despair. Legendary director Ousmane Sembène and co-director Thierno Faty Sow vibrantly imbue the soldiers with dimension and the film shows their camaraderie and solidarity in the face of violence and colonialism.

CAMP DE THAIROYE was restored in 4K at L'Immagine Ritrovata using a second-generation internegative and the original sound negative, preserved at the Tunisian Ministry of Cultural Affairs. Special thanks to Mohamed Challouf and Association Ciné-Sud Patrimoine.



EDUCATION

THE STORY OF MOVIES

For nearly 20 years, The Film Foundation's cinema literacy initiative has provided free lesson materials to over 152,500 educators across the country. *The Story of Movies* (SOM) offers an array of resources that teach students how to appreciate motion pictures within an artistic, cultural, and historical context. With this knowledge, young people gain a better understanding of the ongoing need to protect and preserve our shared film heritage.

Having completed the most recent SOM curriculum, "Portraits of America: Democracy on Film," the *Story of Movies* team, working closely with senior advisor Jeanine Basinger, turned its attention to "The American West and the Western Film Genre." The 17 films explored in this new curriculum include a robust selection of classic Westerns from Hollywood's Golden Age, silent films from the earliest decades of cinema history, and contemporary films that represent fresh perspectives on this traditional subject matter.



The curriculum surveys how the Western film genre evolved along with the American cultural landscape. Students learn that the mythology of the Western reflects how filmmakers interpreted the social, political, and economic values of American society at that moment. Primary source historical documents of art and literature enhance the exploration of Western movies, making the genre an ideal subject for interdisciplinary study.

"The American West and the Western Film Genre" is organized thematically into four modules, each addressing a different aspect of the West's complex history.

Module 1 – "The American Frontier." This module looks at how filmmakers portray the rugged beauty of the deserts and mountains that are so emblematic of the American West, and how the land challenged and hardened the pioneers who migrated Westward in search of new homes and opportunities.

Module 2 – "Creating Community and Nation Building." In this module, students learn that Western movies are rooted in historical events and conflicts—for example, the shootout at the O.K. Corral, the great American cattle drive, the conflict between homesteaders and the cattlemen who fought to maintain an open range, and the essential role played by women in the establishment of communities on the frontier.

Module 3 - "The Clash of Cultures." One narrative appearing frequently within the Western genre is the conflict between indigenous people and those of European ancestry. Prior to World War II, Native Americans and other people of non-European descent were typically reduced to caricatures or stereotypes—or were missing from the cinematic landscape completely. In contrast, some post-World War II Westerns explicitly addressed issues of racism and treated non-white characters as complex individuals. This module investigates how depictions developed over time, reflecting America's changing social values.

Module 4 – "The Evolution of the Western Genre." This last module presents a timeline illustrating how filmmakers defined and challenged the conventions of the genre. Students discover the progression of Western cinema—from the silent era, when the traditional codes of conduct for the Western hero were first established, to the 1950s and '60s, when the Western anti-hero was introduced, to the 21st century, when filmmakers began to reveal entirely new interpretations of the American West.
